

- The programme offers a blended learning delivery that supports Registered Nurses as adult learners by ensuring a balance between asynchronous and synchronous teaching and learning, between taught and tutor-guided activities, and between individual and shared learning experiences.
- The programme encourages students to challenge their existing beliefs about healthcare and nursing from a national, international and global perspective, and to formulate and justify viewpoints as appropriate.
- Students will locate, evaluate, and apply evidence required to provide ethical, context appropriate

- nursing practice and leadership to benefit patients and healthcare services. By being reflective and having a reflexive awareness, students will learn to share and debate different perspectives on healthcare within a community of practice and a wider audience using information technology as well as verbal and written communication methods.
- Students are encouraged to become independent thinkers, while developing an ability to collaborate effectively, and to support nursing peers by becoming members of a Learning Community within a multicultural study environment.
- At the end of the programme, graduates will be ready to extend the support as they will have developed the skills and knowledge equipping them to teach and support learners in practice.

With an ageing population and the ongoing pandemic, demand for healthcare professionals in Singapore has increased significantly and this is especially the case for nurses who make up the largest professional group of healthcare workers in the country¹. Singapore's Ministry of Health (MOH) efforts are focused on growing the current workforce and boosting productivity through innovation and evidence-based practice².

Northumbria University has developed a multi-faceted programme aimed at empowering students and cultivating the next generation of nursing care leaders through evidence-based practice and innovation to address the needs of the Singapore population and changing local demographics.

Programme Description

The Bachelor of Science Nursing (Top-up) programme is for students with a nursing registration and valid practicing certificate (issued by the Singapore Nursing Board) wishing to advance their study from a Diploma to a Bachelor's Degree, designed for post-registration nurses.

The Bachelor of Science Nursing (Top-up) programme has four unique modules that are particularly relevant to Nursing in Singapore. These are Health Promotion, Innovations in Healthcare, Leading and Developing Practice and Nursing Older People with Complex Needs.

The Bachelor of Science Nursing (Top-up) programme supports the ongoing development of Registered Nurses and incorporates Singapore Nursing Board (SNB) guidance and regulations. Specifically, these are:

- Code for Nurses and Midwives (SNB, 2018a)
- Core Competencies of Registered Nurse (SNB, 2018b)
- Scope of Professional Nursing and Midwifery Practice (SNB, 2019a)

In addition, the programme is designed following the Standards for Nurse Education (SNB, 2019b) and Curriculum Requirements for Bachelor of Nursing (Post-Registration) (SNB, 2018c) to meet the requirements of the Singapore Nursing Board, Singapore's healthcare sector and the population.

Students who complete the Bachelor of Science Nursing (Top-up) programme will be equipped with the skills needed to strengthen the current Nursing workforce in Singapore and boost productivity and efficiency in a sector impacted by a shortage of talent. Graduates will also be well positioned to play leading roles in the evolving healthcare sector from improving health literacy to positively impacting the community as evidence-based practitioners promoting multi-disciplinary care.

Programme Delivery

The Bachelor of Science Nursing (Top-up) Degree programme can be completed in 24 months on a part-time basis. It offers a blended learning delivery comprising of face-to-face, asynchronous and synchronous-facilitated learning in the form of lectures, seminars, tutorials and workshops.


Programme Modules

The programme consists of 8 modules of 10 credits per module, making a total of 80 credits. Students will study two modules per term.

Programme Management

The programme management team provides vital administrative support for students throughout their academic journey such as providing regular programme updates. The team will also assist students with advice on policies and procedures.





Research as Evidence for Nursing Practice

This module will support students to develop knowledge about research methods, appraisal and statistics in order to increase confidence as a critical consumer of the research evidence underpinning nursing practice.

Upon completion of the module, graduates will:

- Be able to critically reflect on the impact of research ethics on their own practice.
- Have a comprehensive knowledge of research methods, statistics and critical appraisal skills to appraise research and apply their findings to healthcare and nursing practice.
- Understand and apply critical appraisal frameworks for the review and appraisal of evidence-based practice.

Innovations in Healthcare

This module focuses on how nurses as individuals can maximise efficiency and efficacy in patient treatment options, highlighting both high and low-tech innovations as key alternatives in patient care.

Students will explore and critically analyse the contribution made by technology and innovation to screening, diagnosis, treatment and nursing care. The impact these processes have on patients of all ages, families and communities will also be explored.

Upon completion of the module, graduates will:

- Communicate to a professional audience.
- Critically understand healthcare innovations and their influence on practice, their strengths, and limitations.
- Evaluate the nurse's role in improving healthcare through innovation.
- Explore information about varying forms of healthcare innovations in Singapore.

Teaching and Learning

This module will explore a variety of approaches to support effective teaching, learning and assessment in a professional practice context. With an emphasis on multi professional and interprofessional working, students will develop a detailed understanding of the planning, delivery and evaluation of high quality, inclusive learning opportunities in the practice area.

Upon completion of the module, graduates will:

- Critically explore the efficacy of commonly adopted approaches when planning and delivering teaching and learning in a practice environment.
- Engage in research tutored learning where they will be actively supported to develop their knowledge, skills and understanding of key research rich educational principles.
- Identify educational enhancements drawn from their own area of practice and professional discipline.

Health Promotion

This module will ensure students gain a comprehensive understanding of how improving health literacy and promotion can positively impact communities by increasing awareness of early detection and screening as well as chronic disease prevention and management in line with Singapore's MOH community health statistics.

Students will explore and analyse the health status of a context appropriate service population in order to produce a profile of their health needs.

Students will also explore multidisciplinary working and service-user involvement for health improvement, and this will include learning techniques used to empower patients and clients to make healthier choices.

Upon completion of the module, graduates will:

- Have a comprehensive knowledge of current health promotion approaches and how to apply them in healthcare and nursing practice.
- Understand the role of nurses in health promotion.
- Be able to critically debate the impact of ethics and health inequalities on their own practice.
- Have the skills and knowledge to work with multidisciplinary teams for health promotion.

Healthcare Law and Ethics


Students will gain a comprehensive knowledge of how current Singapore Law and policies impact healthcare and the nursing practice. They will develop a comprehensive understanding of how unconscious bias can influence decision making. There will be a strong focus on how to resolve ethical dilemmas in practice.

Upon completion of the module, graduates will:

- Be able to critically reflect on the impact of ethics on their own practice.
- Have a comprehensive knowledge of current law and policies, and how to apply it in healthcare and nursing practice.
- Have the skills, knowledge and confidence to challenge unethical practice.
- Understand the role of unconscious bias in their own practice.

Nursing Older People with Complex Needs

This module focuses on multiple gerontological evidence-based approaches to diseases prevalent in Singapore such as dementia and delirium with emphasis on collaboration and multidisciplinary teamwork aimed at achieving the best outcomes for patients. It is designed to enable students to apply in-classroom knowledge to healthcare settings.



Students will develop knowledge and understanding of the complex needs of older people within the context of health and social care in Singapore. The module will develop knowledge and competence in nursing older people across health and life continua: from living well, acute illness, intermediate care, frailty, ongoing long-term care to end of life, providing understanding of significant issues at transitional points.

Upon completion of the module, graduates will:

- Be able to critically analyse gerontological evidencebased approaches to older persons' care.
- Have a comprehensive understanding of the complexities of health and ill health in older people.
- Have the skills, knowledge, and confidence to explore and challenge personal and societal attitudes, values and beliefs which may impact on nursing care.
- Understand the importance of working in both multidisciplinary and unidisciplinary contexts.

Health and Physical Assessment

This module aims to develop practitioners by increasing their ability to assess, examine and manage patients with a wide range of clinical presentations. It will build upon previous experience, knowledge and skills of holistic health and assessment, and will enhance the development of clinical assessment and decision-making.

Upon completion of the module, graduates will:

- Demonstrate their clinical history-taking and holistic nursing assessment skills.
- Develop their personal and professional skills and attributes for undertaking a holistic health assessment.
- Have a comprehensive knowledge of current law and policy and how to apply them in healthcare and nursing practice.
- Understand the significant role communication and clinical decision making has within holistic health assessments.





Leading and Developing Practice

This module focuses on ensuring students understand the importance of a multidisciplinary collaboration and leadership in healthcare, and how it plays a critical role in optimising overall patient wellbeing and managing change. It helps to explore the skills they need and build their confidence in order to instigate and lead positive change in practice.

It also focuses on the transition to Graduate Nursing practice through a closer examination of the subjects of leadership and practice development. It will encourage an emerging responsiveness to the clinical demands of an ever-changing local, national and global healthcare

landscape and the dynamic needs of people of all ages, families and communities.

Upon completion of the module, graduates will:

- Be able to enact decision-making processes to inform and underpin professional practice and enhance patient care.
- Have the skills, knowledge, and confidence to lead on practice development.
- Have a comprehensive knowledge of models and tools for engaging and measuring improvements in practice.
